Adam Liff, PhD, is Associate Professor of East Asian international relations at the IU Hamilton Lugar School (EALC Department), where he also serves founding director of its 21st Century Japan Politics and Society Initiative ("21JPSI") and founding organizer of its "East Asia and the World" Speaker Series. Beyond IU, he is a Nonresident Senior Fellow with the Center for East Asia Policy Studies at the Brookings Institution, as well as an Associate-in-Research at Harvard University's Reischauer Institute of Japanese Studies and Fairbank Center for Chinese Studies. He holds a Ph.D. and M.A. in Politics from Princeton University, and a B.A. from Stanford University (with Distinction; with Honors; and Phi Beta Kappa). In 2019, he was awarded the university's campus-wide Outstanding Junior Faculty Award.

Liff's research focuses primarily on Asia-Pacific security affairs—especially Japanese security policy and the U.S.-Japan alliance; Japan and East Asia; U.S. Asia-Pacific strategy; Taiwan; and the rise of China. Recent topical interests include the ongoing evolution of Japan's defense policy/the U.S.-Japan alliance; Japan-Taiwan relations; and U.S. treaty allies' positions and evolving policies vis-a-vis Taiwan.

Liff's scholarship has been published in Asia Policy, Asian Survey, The China Quarterly, International Relations of the Asia-Pacific, International Security, Japanese Journal of Political Science, Japanese Studies, Journal of Contemporary China, Journal of Japanese Studies, Journal of Strategic Studies, Security Studies, Texas National Security Review, The Washington Quarterly, and Washington University Global Studies Law Review, and has been cited widely in global media, including in The Wall Street Journal, The New York Times, Reuters, Foreign Affairs, Associated Press, Bloomberg, Financial Times, Japan Times, Tokyo Shimbun and The Economist. Other publications include several book chapters in edited volumes and shorter analytical pieces published in Foreign Affairs, Foreign Policy, the Asahi Shimbun, and other venues.
