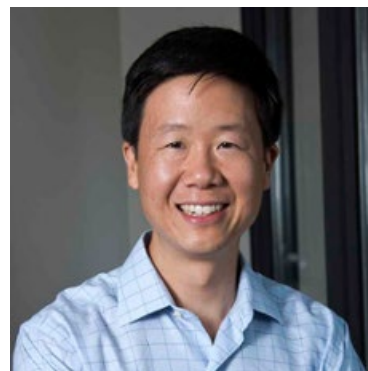

Anthony Liu, PhD, Associate Professor, working in IUB's O'Neill School of Public and Environmental Affairs since 2015, was previously a visiting assistant professor of economics at the Cheung Kong Graduate School of Business in China, a fellow at Resources for the Future in Washington, D.C., and a research analyst at The Brookings Institution. Liu has held short-term consultancies with the World Bank Climate Change Carbon Markets, King Abdullah Petroleum Studies and Research Center, World Bank Development Research Group, World Bank Climate Change Group, the Environment for Development Initiative, and the Shanghai Academy of Development.

Liu's research interests include climate change policy and the environment in developing countries. Some of his recent work addresses carbon taxes and the unique properties that could make them attractive components of modern tax systems. Liu is also interested in pollution issues and the interactions between the environment and the economy in China. He has also studied large-scale water treatment infrastructure in China.

Liu has published in the *Journal of Environmental Economics and Management*, *China Economic Review*, *Journal of Development Economics*, *Annual Review of Resource Economics*, *Environmental and Resource Economics*, *Energy Policy*, and *The B.E. Journal of Economic Analysis and Policy*. In addition, he has authored publications such as "Supporting the Government of Botswana in Designing a Carbon Tax" (lead author) for the World Bank Group Partnership for Market Readiness and "Carbon Tax Guide: A Handbook for Policy Makers," (co-authored with many other investigators) for the World Bank.

Liu earned his Ph.D. in economics from the University of California, San Diego, a master's in economics from the University of California, Santa Barbara, and his bachelor's in economics (minor: chemistry) from Stanford University.
