Marianne Kamp, PhD, is Associate Professor in the Department of Central Eurasian Studies (HLS) and Adjunct Associate Professor in the Departments of History (Labor and Work) and Middle Eastern Languages and Cultures.

Her research interests are Central Asian states and societies under Soviet rule and since independence; oral history; women, gender, and social change; history of the family; agriculture, cotton, collectivization and its undoing; Central Asia and the Cold War.

To date, Kamp has written two books, *Muslim Women of the Fergana Valley: A 19th Century Ethnography of Central Asia*, translated from the 19th century Russian original with Mariana Markova, which was published in 2016 by Indiana University Press, and *The New Woman in Uzbekistan: Islam, Modernity and Unveiling under Communism*, published in 2006 by University of Washington Press. She has also written various chapters and published articles in *Kritika: Explorations in Russian and Eurasian History*, *Central Asian Survey*, *Current History*, and *Journal of Women's History*.

Kamp teaches courses on Oil, Islam and Geopolitics; Politics and Society in Central Asia; Labor and Migration in Central Asia; Central Asia in Soviet Times; and Gender and Women in Central Asia.
