BIO SKETCH – Jordan Lynton

Jordan Lynton is a <u>PhD Candidate</u> in the IU Department of Anthropology, a Fellow in the IU <u>Ostrom Workshop</u> in Political Theory and Policy Analysis, and a Councilor of the <u>Society for Latin American and Caribbean Anthropology</u>. Funded by the Fulbright Hays Program, her dissertation research explores how legacies of colonialism and indenture, as well as People's Republic of China-sponsored development in the Caribbean, complicate co-ethnic identification and immigrant incorporation within Chinese communities in Jamaica. Specifically, this project interrogates "diaspora" by examining how Chinese Jamaican, new Chinese migrants, and local organizations navigate community membership despite conflicting understandings of Chinese identity, culture, ethnicity, language, and national identity. Jordan is also passionate about digital humanities, critical pedagogy, and the intersections between technology and storytelling.
