Anita Plummer, Ph.D., Assistant Professor, Director of Undergraduate Studies, Department of African Studies, Howard University, Washington, DC.

Dr. Plummer's research and teaching focus on African political economy, transnationalism, public diplomacy, and Sino-African relations. Before joining the faculty at Howard University, she taught International Studies at Spelman College in Atlanta, Georgia, and at the University of California Los Angeles was a Mellon post-doctoral fellow in the Cultures in Transnational Perspective Program and Visiting Assistant Professor of Global Studies and Political Science. Plummer was awarded a Carter G. Woodson Center Pre-doctoral fellowship at the University of Virginia where she researched Mandarin language in Africa.

Dr. Plummer has conducted field research in China, Kenya, South Africa, Mozambique, and Senegal. Her articles on China's engagements in Africa have been published in the *National Political Science Review*, the *Journal of Asian and African Studies*, *Africa*, the *AfricaFocus Bulletin*, and *Foreign Policy in Focus*. For four years, she taught classes on China and Africa at the Foreign Service Institute, consulted with the State Department, and testified before the House Committee on Foreign Affairs. Her current book project *Street-Level Discourses: Change, Power and Agency in Kenya's Engagements with China* focuses on grassroots perspectives and responses to China's increased political and economic interventions in Africa.
