Aaron Baute, Ph.D., has been the Vice President of Business, Logistics, and Supply Chain Workforce Alignment for the Ivy Tech Statewide System since 2017. Previously, he was Technology Division Dean at the Lafayette Campus and three additional sites. He worked extensively with Workforce Alignment and industry partners to support the efforts for training, assessment, and professional development aligned with industry needs. Baute also served on one of the first Transfer Single Articulation Pathway committees to provide all Indiana Public College students a single pathway from the community college to Indiana Public 4-year institutions in Business.

Baute worked with supply chain, and logistics issues extensively during his nineteen-year tenure with FedEx Corporation. He served in a variety of management and leadership capacities both at FedEx Ground and FedEx Corporate Services which included areas of Senior Management, Sales Development, and Operation Management and included significant contributions to the launch of FedEx Home Delivery.

Baute earned his Doctorate in Leadership in Higher Education from Indiana State University, his Master of Business Administration from Indiana Wesleyan University, and a Bachelor of Science in Computer Integrated Manufacturing through the School of Engineering and Technology from Purdue University.
